ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE:

Foundational Level (Classes LKG-II):

The early years of education at DAV NUPPL Public School are guided by progressive pedagogical approaches, emphasizing play-based, experiential, and activity-driven learning. To promote hands-on engagement, students participated in diverse activities such as show & tell, origami, ad-mad, collage, cotton pasting, lacing & beading, souvenir plates, finger painting, and nature walks. Experiential learning was further enriched through guided visits to the Science Laboratory and Library. The school adheres to a No Examination Policy at this level, opting instead for continuous formative assessments conducted via worksheets.

Preparatory, Middle, and Secondary Levels (Classes III-IX):

Advanced educational technologies were seamlessly integrated into the instructional process, utilizing multimedia tools such as educational videos, PowerPoint presentations, and interactive live worksheets. Our teaching methodologies encompass activity-based learning, demonstration, and experiential practices, art integration, sports integration, and skill-oriented learning facilitating a deeper understanding of complex concepts. Subject-specific enrichment programs, including Mental Maths Workshops, Empowering English Sessions, and Fun with Science Activities, provided avenues for student engagement beyond the textbook. Sustainable practices such as tree plantation and seed germination were embedded into the curriculum to foster environmental awareness. A robust assessment framework was implemented, combining Summative Assessments (Unit Tests, Mid-term, and Annual Examinations) with continuous Formative Assessments through varied subject-based activities. Critical 21st-century competencies, such as problem-solving, critical thinking, and independent research, were systematically integrated into the teaching-learning process.

Sports Fiesta 2.0:

The Sports Fiesta was held for classes LKG to X on December 30, 2023, in which various competitions like Relay Race 4x100 M, Hurdle Race, Frog Race, Dress & Run Race, Tug of war, Slow Cycling Race, etc. were conducted. Archery & Taekwondo Sessions were held for the students throughout the year & Boxing Classes were introduced.

CO-CURRICULAR ENRICHMENT
